Where?

Instruments

When you arrive in school leave your instruments in the Ensemble Room. Cellos should be left in the rack and violins, violas, flutes, clarinets and cornets should be stored in the cupboards. Do not leave your instrument on the floor unless it is too big to fit in the cupboards. Smaller instruments can be kept in your locker. Never leave your instrument in the corridor.

Please note that your instrument is not insured by the school against loss or accidental damage when on school premises. Check that you are properly covered by a suitable policy with a recommended musical instrument insurance company.

Lessons

When?

You will be given a timetable. Please keep this safely and check it weekly so that you turn up for your lesson at the right time. Timetables are also displayed outside W1.

Subject Teachers

It is very important that you excuse yourself from the class you will be missing in order to attend your instrumental lesson. For example, if you have a flute lesson during Period 1 on Thursday and will be missing Maths, make sure that you see your Maths teacher before Thursday to excuse yourself from the class. You should also make sure that you catch up with all work that you miss.

Instrumental Teacher

If you are unable to attend your instrumental lesson make sure that you let your teacher or Mr Frankland know in advance. If you are absent on the day of your lesson make sure that you tell Mr Frankland when you return to school.

Many people would like to learn to play an instrument. You must make the most of your opportunity by practising regularly, always attending your lesson and taking part in musical ensembles.
